



The central message of the poem is the enduring potential of nature to inspire and uplift us, long after the experience itself has passed.







Underwear, What Underwear?

From Humble Langot to modern boxers, Male underwear in India has come a long way.

For an incredibly long time, the concept of an underwear for men and women did not exist in India. There is evidence to suggest that Indian men did wear the antariya made up of sheer cloth (passed between the legs and tucked behind) around 250 AD but it was an outerwear. Now only worn by holy men, or sadhus, and wrestlers; The langot or kaupina was the first clothing resembling underwear, was born. It was believed to heighten spirituality and increase physical self-control in men. It was also linked with the Hindu god Shiva and one of the five symbols of Khalsa Sikhs. Imagine, Salwaar Kameez as an indian formal!

A long tunic with traditional silhouette and embellishments with high craftmanship; Kameez was widely worn by people from South Asia, typically with a salwar / churidar. Before the introduction of the indo-western wear, the churidar Kameez was worn by working-class women. These clothes

What is Natural Dyeing?

Madder root, indigo and turmeric.
They were the most used in antiquity as they were the easiest to find and develop. They are fermented and treated to turn into a dye.
The discovery of this scrap and dying facilities at the excavation site confirms that Harrapans dyed their cloth with the natural substances listed above. Only a single scrap of cloth that had been dyed a madder red has been found and preserved from that era.



The five-year-old Siri back then wanted to be all that Barbie was, she wanted to achieve those unattainable body and beauty standards.

The Elephant Whisperers' released on 8th December 2022 is an Oscar-winning Indian documentary short movie, set in the Mudumalai Tiger Reserve, Tamil Nadu, India.

Directed by Kartiki Gonsalves, this poignant movie narrates the life of the tribal people who dedicated their lives to protecting the forest and its beings. The movie portrays the daily life of a family of four as well as the everyday lives of other elephant caretakers residing in the elephant camp in Mudumalai.

The forty-minute movie follows the story of Bellie and Bomman, a tribal couple who raised two orphaned elephants, Raghu and Ammu. Raghu is an orphaned elephant calf who was separated from its herd when they trespassed into the village in search of food and water due to the extreme droughts. Unfortunately, his mother was electrocuted to death. Raghu was later found by the forest department in very bad shape. Bomman and Bellie were assigned the duty of taking care of the calf and they successfully nurtured it back to health.

Since they had successfully raised Raghu, the couple was handed over another calf, Ammu, as most people had failed to take proper care of elephant calves.

This movie gives us an insight into the lives of the forest people and emphasizes the importance of preserving nature. It also sheds light on the grave issues revolving around elephants trespassing and damaging the village when, in fact, they are simply trying to survive. Human actions that damage nature have serious consequences that are harmful not only for us but also for wildlife.

The Elephant whisperers is truly a wonderful, heart touching movie. It was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Documentary Short Film.

"Maybe there is a beast.... maybe it's only us." Simon, Lord of the Flies


