

The Masterclass on Sustainable Leather Innovation: Eucalyptus Bio-Leather was conducted by Mr. Manish Pareek, Founder of Eori™ Vegan Leather and alumnus of IIM, Lucknow. Eori™ Vegan Leather pioneers eco-friendly alternatives to traditional leather, using sustainable materials such as eucalyptus cellulose, agricultural waste, and post-consumer textiles, while ensuring zero effluent discharge.

This session introduced Eori™ Bio Leather, an eco-friendly alternative to traditional leather crafted from eucalyptus cellulose, agricultural waste, and post-consumer cotton. Students explored its applications in footwear, bags, garments, and lifestyle products, while the session emphasized its environmental, ethical, and commercial benefits as a sustainable material for the future of fashion.

The Masterclass on Future Forward: Intelligent & Connected Lifestyle Products in Fashion & Footwear was conducted by Mr.

Yash Kumar, Ms. Anjali Soni, and Mr. Priyam Saxena from CreAct Academy. CreAct Academy is a pioneering platform that provides hands-on education in AI, robotics, and smart technologies, empowering students to design intelligent, tech-integrated products while bridging the gap between theory and practice.

The session offered valuable insights into smart wearables and next-generation lifestyle products, emphasizing the role of smart sensors and advanced technology in fashion accessories. Ms. Jinali Mody, Founder of Banofi and a MANAGE-CIA Cohort 8 entrepreneur, shared how her college project grew into a sustainable business with real industry impact.

The session was chaired by Ms. Tanisha Chatterjee, Business Development Associate at Banofi, who explained the chemistry, functionality, and future prospects of vegan leather. She highlighted Banofi's vision of replacing animal leather with eco-friendly alternatives that reduce toxic waste, carbon emissions, and water usage.





Students and faculty gained valuable insights into market dynamics, innovation potential, and real-world applications of plant-based leathers. The webinar emphasized not only environmental protection but also new income opportunities for farmers—making sustainability a holistic journey.

The event concluded with interactive discussions, leaving participants inspired to reimagine design with responsibility. The story of Banofi Leather reinforced FDDI's commitment to nurturing designers who move beyond aesthetics towards sustainability, functionality, and social impact.

A live demonstration showcased the transformation of crust leather into finished shoes through sanding, burnishing, dyeing, waxing, lacquering, buffing, and spray finishing. Students also participated hands-on, experimenting with color layering and texture enhancement under expert guidance.

The workshop effectively bridged classroom learning with industry practices, giving students practical exposure to the latest finishing techniques and packaging standards.






This hands-on experience demonstrated how origami principles can inspire product development, blending creativity, precision, and innovation.

Together, these workshops not only enriched students' technical knowledge but also nurtured their originality and design vision, marking an inspiring start to the academic year.

## FDP Batch 2024 of FDDI, Hyderabad Campus Explores Footwear Innovations at SPORTS EXPO 2025

As part of their academic engagement under "Techniques of User Research," the students of Footwear Design & Production (FDP) Batch 2024 of FDDI, Hyderabad Campus actively participated in SPORTS EXPO 2025 at the HITEX Exhibition Centre on 23rd August 2025. The visit offered students an interactive platform to explore advancements in sports and wellness, with a special focus on footwear technology and user-centric design.

During the expo, students underwent free foot diagnostic tests to assess conditions like flat feet and understand their impact on knee and ankle biomechanics. They also participated in footprint and leg axis analyses, gaining insights into posture-related conditions such as supination and overpronation, along with personalized insole recommendations. Students actively engaged in fitness challenges, including plank holds and squat contests, earning recognition on the event leaderboard. Hands-on sessions with insole materials such as silicone full insoles, heel pads, and memory foam inserts allowed them to connect theoretical knowledge with practical functionality and comfort levels. The team also explored organic wellness products, particularly those derived from cow milk, highlighting the intersection of natural living and sports nutrition. Exposure to advanced footwear technologies like Core GEL cushioning and FlyteFoam further demonstrated how innovation enhances comfort and athletic performance.

The visit enabled students to apply classroom concepts in a real-world setting, strengthening their skills in user research, product evaluation, and ergonomic design while bridging the gap between academic learning and industry practices. FDP Batch 2024 demonstrated enthusiasm and professionalism, making a commendable representation of the department at SPORTS EXPO 2025.

# Foot Anatomy Seminar at FDDI, Hyderabad Campus in Collaboration with LEPRA Society

The School of Footwear Design & Production (FDP), FDDI Hyderabad, in collaboration with LEPRA Society, organized a Fabulous Friday seminar on "Understanding Foot Anatomy: A Key to Footwear Innovation" on 22nd August 2025. The session was delivered by Mr. Jaladi Zakariah, Senior Physiotherapist, LEPRA Society, who shared his expertise on the structural and functional aspects of the human foot and their significance in footwear design.

LEPRA Society, a non-governmental organization, works towards quality healthcare and the management of neglected diseases such as leprosy, lymphatic filariasis, and diabetes. It also supports footwear manufacturing with orthoses to aid individuals with foot deformities.

During the seminar, Mr. Zakariah explained the anatomy of the human foot, including bones, ligaments, muscles, and joints, highlighting their role in posture, balance, and mobility. He connected biomechanics and gait cycles to innovative footwear design, emphasizing how understanding foot anatomy leads to better fit, comfort, and functionality, particularly for therapeutic and orthopedic footwear. An interactive Q&A session allowed students to clarify doubts and explore the scope of specialized footwear design, bridging medical knowledge with design innovation.





The second patent was granted for a 'Bangle' Design (Design No. 464170-001, Class 11-01, Journal No. 36/2025). Created in collaboration with Dr. Ravindra Babu Veguri, Dr. Konduparti Maalyada, and Mr. Anukula Ananda Srihari from the Department of Fine & Performing Arts, GITAM University, the design draws inspiration from Hyderabad's traditional lac bangle markets at Charminar, Chudi Bazaar, Raydurgam,
