FDDI Collaborates with FITT, IIT Delhi for Research and Innovation

FDDI has entered into a strategic collaboration with the Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi (IIT Delhi).

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed with the Foundation for Innovation and Technology Transfer (FITT), IIT Delhi, on 24th September 2025. This partnership marks a significant step forward in advancing research and development, consultancy activities, and knowledge transfer between the two premier institutions.

The MoU encompasses the exchange of academic and research materials, publications, and intellectual properties; cooperation in project proposals and research activities of mutual interest; organization of joint short-term programs and intellectual enrichment opportunities; and the shared use of laboratory and research facilities to strengthen collaborative innovation and skill development.

FDDI, India Signs Landmark MoA with the University of Northampton, UK

FDDI, India has signed a comprehensive Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) with the University of Northampton (UoN), United Kingdom (UK).





On behalf of FDDI, Mr. Vivek Sharma, IRS, Managing Director (MD), signed the MoA whereas from UoN, Mr. Anne-Marie Kilday, Vice – Chancellor and Professor of Criminal History signed the MoA on 13th August 2025 which will remain in force for three years, with provisions for renewal by mutual consent.



The AI Youth Skills Training Program was held at FDDI Fursatganj on 4th September 2025 under the Uttar Pradesh Government's AI Pragya






FDDI, Rohtak and Noida Faculty Contribute to Book on Innovative Agrotextile Solutions



The article, titled "An Evaluation of Retail Fashion Brands – A Personality Perspective", explores how brand personality shapes consumer perceptions, brand love, and brand loyalty in the fashion retail sector.

The study emphasizes that consumer preference for fashion apparel brands is largely driven by self-image, social status, self-expression, and self-construction motives. Fashion brands, often associated with exclusivity and uniqueness, serve as strong symbols of self-identity and self-enhancement. Consumers are more likely to emotionally connect with brands that exhibit human-like traits and align with their self-concept.

The article also highlights the managerial implications of building brand personality to enhance consumer–brand relationships. Future research directions include employing probability sampling methods and conducting longitudinal studies to better understand the evolving dynamics between consumers and brands.

With over 10 years of teaching experience, he specializes in machining, polymer processing, rapid prototyping, and 3D printing. He has supervised multiple M.Tech and B.Tech projects and published research papers in SCIE and Scopus-indexed journals.

The research, conducted on a high-precision Electric Discharge Machine (EDM) with a rotating electrode, provides significant industrial insights. It demonstrates that dry EDM, which uses compressed air instead of dielectric liquids, is not only more environmentally friendly but also delivers superior surface quality. On the other hand,

Comparative study of conventional EDM and dry EDM machinability of superalloy Inconel 800 Superalloys are a class of high-performance materials known for their exceptional mechanical strength, heat resistance and corrosion resistance. Inconel 800 is primarily composed of base metals such as nickel, cobalt or iron, along with a combination of alloying elements such as chromium, aluminumand titanium, which make it ideal for demanding applications in aerospace, power generation and other industries (Khakian et al., 2016). Machining such a high-strength alloy is difficult by conventional methods,

wet EDM enables faster material removal, making it ideal where machining speed is critical.
